From the North

Travel on Interstate 10 West until you come to Interstate 37 North. Proceed on Interstate 37 North and exit at Commerce Street. Turn left on Commerce Street and travel until you come to Navarro Street. Turn right on Navarro Street and continue to Travis Street. Turn left on Travis Street and continue to St. Mary's Street. The hotel drive is on the left.

From the South

Continuing Education Workshop Information

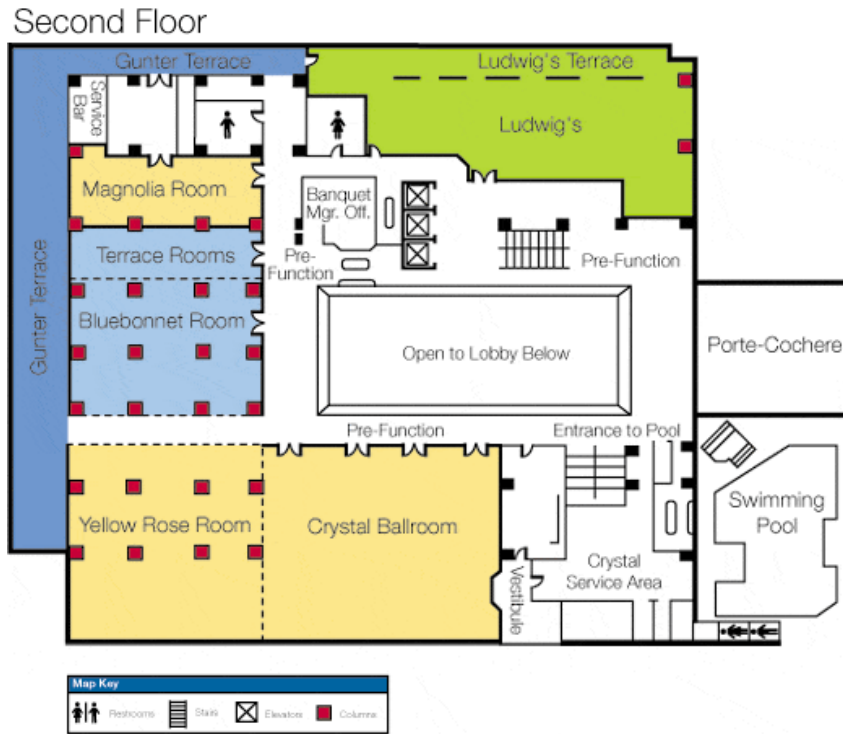

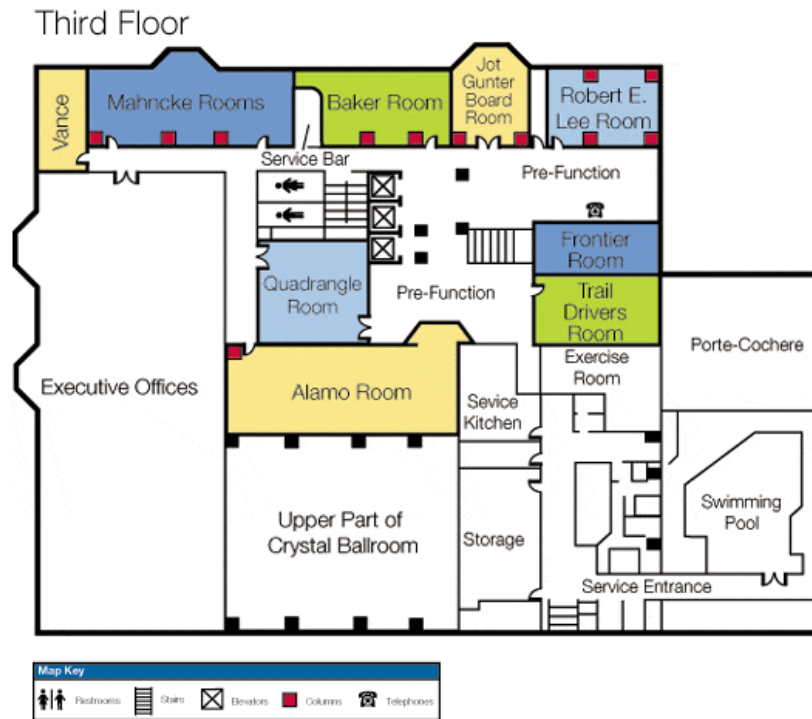

Human intelligence is more fragile than we tend to think. It is fragile because it is transacted within a web of social relations, which are themselves often fragile. In this talk Dr. Aronson will discuss one social force that undermines people's academic achievement— stereotypes alleging the intellectual ability of certain minorities. Such stereotypes often create an atmosphere of threat, mistrust, and low expectations, and in this atmosphere, academic achievement of minorities is often undermined. In this talk Dr. Aronson will discuss research on "stereotype threat," and show how it explains part of the achievement gap between minorities and whites. Dr. Aronson will also discuss research that shows us how to help students at risk for underperformance.

When employers think about cutting costs, the idea of initiating a new policy that would allow employees more decision latitude over their work schedule is rarely considered because it is difficult for most employers to see how such policies would save them money. The more usual response to economic downturns is to reduce the number of hours employees work or the number of employees-business executives think about cuts when considering ways to save money and tend to ignore other possibilities, such as ways to reduce the cost per employee by reducing absences and increasing employee loyalty. The Animal Training Department at Sea World utilizes a powerful training technique called the “Least Reinforcing Stimulus.” This proactive training technique has been in use at all Sea World parks since 1985, and successfully reduces the frequency of aggressive behavior that might otherwise result from the lack of reinforcement due to incorrect or inappropriate behaviors. Once an animal has a sufficient learning history with the LRS, its use following an incorrect response helps to reduce the frustration that might result from the lack of reinforcement
